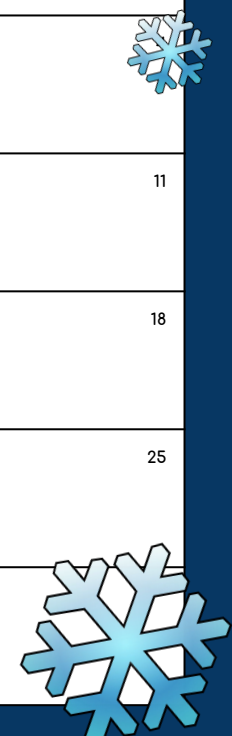

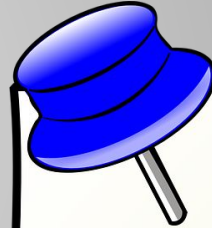

ATTENDANCE REMINDERS

Attendance at school is essential to the successful completion of an education. Good communication from the school to the home and from the home to the school regarding absences is a major responsibility for the school and the home. Part of the school's mission is to teach students good work habits, which includes regular attendance.

All attendance matters (signing in or out, special leave requests, passes to leave school, reporting absences, etc.) are handled at the attendance desk. The attendance desk is located in the main office inside the Door D entrance.

- **Please report all absences by 7:30 a.m.** by calling the attendance line at 526-1369. *If we do not hear from you, we will attempt to contact you to verify the absence. If no contact occurs, the absence will be considered unexcused.*
- **If your child needs to leave school during the school day:** *To avoid interruptions to the classroom we ask that you send a note with your student in the morning. They should bring the note to the attendance desk before school starts in the morning and we will issue them a pass to leave class. When it is time for them to leave, it is the student's responsibility to report to the attendance desk and wait for you to sign them out. Upon returning to school, the student is to sign in at the attendance desk to obtain a pass to return to class.*
- **If your child arrives late for school:** *Please send a note with your child or call (526-1369) so we can excuse him/her. Upon arrival he/she should report to the attendance desk to sign in and get a pass for class.*
- **Homework requests:** *If you wish to request homework, please leave that message when you call in your child's absence. Your child can also check his/her homework from their Chromebook.*

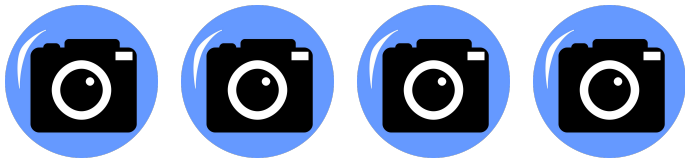

Holmen Middle School is once again participating in the Noetic Learning Math Contest. Every year, more than 30,000 students from more than 500 schools across the United States participate in the contest and compete against each other.

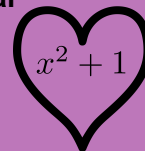
The Noetic Learning Math Contest encourages students to excel in math by mastering their problem-solving skills. In the Contest, Mathletes apply their problem-solving skills and the math concepts they learn in math class to solve twenty non-routine math problems that call for creativity, originality, and thinking skills.

NLMC Mathletes are given 45 minutes to solve 20 challenging math problems with paper and pencil. We conduct the contest during the school day. The high scorer at each grade level receives a Team Winner medal. The top 10% of all students nationwide at each grade level receive National Honor Roll medals. The top 50% of students at each grade level receive National Honorable Mention ribbons.

The Fall Contest is in November, but Mrs. Stein will hold practices in October for those students who are interested. The practices are NOT mandatory. Have your child watch the digital signage in the cafeteria or listen to the daily announcements for the dates of the practices and how to sign up for the competition.

STUDENT SERVICES

~GREETINGS~

Grade level school counselors have already been busy in the classroom with your students. Each fall we start off with an introduction lesson to review our role as school counselors and other important information to start the year strong. One of the essential things we cover with all three grade levels is creating a shared understanding of what we call a “crisis” or “emergency” in the area of student safety and how to access help depending on the timing, either during the school day or outside of school hours. We want to share this information with you as well, so we are all able to work together in partnership to support our young people and their navigation of an increasingly complex world.

Help during a crisis: A crisis situation is when an individual is experiencing harm or the threat of harm from someone else, learns about harm or potential harm to someone else, or if they are feeling at risk for self-harm. We teach students that in a crisis situation, we want them to talk with somebody right away who can help. We want young people to have an actual verbal conversation with a trusted adult who can support them or access additional support, rather than relying on electronic communication.

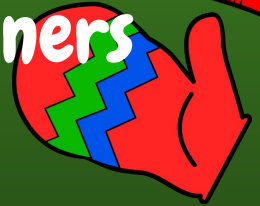

PERTUSSIS (WHOOPIING COUGH)



Pertussis, also called whooping cough, is a disease that is caused by a bacteria that attaches to the lining of the lungs. At first a person may feel like they have a cold with a runny nose, low-grade fever, and slight cough. After about a week, the person can start to have violent dry, coughing fits that can last a minute or longer. These fits can make it hard to breathe. Often during the coughing fits, a person needs to take a deep breath, which causes a “whooping” sound. Sometimes the coughing fits lead to vomiting. The disease is most serious in babies and can cause pneumonia (a lung infection). Half of babies who catch whooping cough go to the hospital and some even die.

How is it spread?



- ▶ Pertussis is caused by a bacteria that can easily be spread from person to person.
- ▶ Babies can catch pertussis from anyone around them (e.g., parents, siblings, grandparents, or babysitters) who spread the disease while holding or caring for the baby.
- ▶ The bacteria travels through the air on droplets of saliva. It can be spread by a sick person coughing or sneezing, or by spending time near an infected person.
- ▶ Infected people can spread pertussis up to three weeks after the cough begins if they are not treated with the appropriate antibiotics.

What are the signs and symptoms?



Early Symptoms

- ▶ Runny nose
- ▶ Occasional cough

Later Symptoms

- ▶ Fits of violent coughs that may be followed by a deep breath that makes a “whoop” sound or vomiting
- ▶ Coughing fits that make it difficult to breathe

How can pertussis be prevented?



The best way to prevent pertussis among babies, teens, and adults is to get vaccinated.

- ▶ Children need five doses of DTaP (Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis) vaccine; the series is administered at ages 2, 4, 6, and 15 months, and a booster between 4 and 6 years of age.
- ▶ Teenagers should get the Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis) vaccine at age 11 or 12 years.
- ▶ Pregnant women should receive one dose of Tdap during each pregnancy, preferably during the early part of gestational weeks 27–36, regardless of prior history of receiving Tdap.
- ▶ Other adults should get at least one Tdap vaccine in their life.
- ▶ Keep babies and other high-risk people away from people who are sick with pertussis.
- ▶ *Talk with your health care professional about getting vaccinated against pertussis.*
